

Recently, there has been an increase in people coming to the police about problems with facebook. Police will generally only investigate facebook complaints when there is a criminal offence involved, for example where there are threats of actual violence.

It is important to be proactive in maintaining a safe account free of abuse.

There are a number of steps you can take to prevent a matter from escalating to this point. Always take steps to keep your account secure and only accept your real friends, never allow strangers or people you do not get along with to be added to your friends list. If you are unsure of how to change your privacy settings or block unwanted friends, go to http://www.facebook.com/help

This site also allows you to report abuse directly to facebook. When a report is submitted to facebook, they investigate the issue and make a determination as to whether or not the content should remain on the site based on their <u>Statement of Rights and Responsibilities</u>.

COUNCIL NEWS 15/11/2010

So much for the holiday and back at work again, a situation that may cause mixed feelings to many. Thanks to Glenn Carroll for preparing the newsletter for the last few weeks.

There was good news and bad news on the health front last week. The good news was that Dr Al Badran has accepted Councils offer of a new two year lease for the Weddin Street premises. His many patients can now look forward to continued treatment at the surgery. However he was adamant he would not be returning to the hospital.

This continues to be of great concern to Council and the community, but there is little we can do about it.

The bad news was that Dr Varejka's surgery has advised Council and GWAHS that he is closing the doors on 16 December. Dr Varejka has conducted his practice in Grenfell for over 25 years and has built up a loyal following who will have to make other arrangements after his departure. His cheery nature and battered cars will be missed by many.

In view of this announcement Council will take the opportunity to re-apply to the Federal Department of Health and Aging for assessment as a District of Workforce Shortage. Two previous applications were rejected because the services provided by the two local doctors exceeded the national average. One would hope that the departure of one of the two doctors would be sufficient justification for most people, but one thing that I have learned is that the health system works in wondrous ways and no-one should assume anything.

Never-the-less it does present an opportunity to work towards improving our services in the future, and Council and the Health Council will pursue this opportunity as best we can.

Actually many people would take exception to me saying that the health system "works": they would strongly maintain that a more appropriate word could be "operates". How Kevin Rudd thought he was going to fix it, I have no idea.

The Weddin Health Council represented by chairman Peter Moffitt and also Nevin Hughes has been working in close partnership with Council throughout this whole drama, trying to restore the VMO services we used to enjoy.

I notice the NSW Department of Health has been calling for nominations for its proposed "Local Boards". These boards will not be local and will be nothing like the previous hospital boards that many people fondly remember. The Grenfell hospital which is currently part of the Greater Western Area Health Service will soon fall into the Western Health Network which will extend from Grenfell to Goodooga, and Cobar to Coolah. I suspect the days of the Weddin Health Council are numbered.

The Ministerial Taskforce for the Blayney-Cowra-Demondrille rail line met in Cowra recently and appointed the firm of Booz & Co as the consultant to prepare the business plan for the possible re-opening of the line. The consultant is due to meet with the local steering committee this week in Cowra and anticipates the final report will be available in April.

The five councils have already had to deal with two different Ministers so far, and an April date may mean they have to then deal with a third. We shall see.

If you noticed a lot of visitors and cars in Main Street over the weekend, it was due to a district meeting of one of our service clubs. The facilities at the new Community Hub have brought this group to town for the second year in a row. Apparently very few towns can offer a private meeting room with scope to break down into smaller groups, so not only has the Hub been hired but accommodation establishments, cafes and local shops have benefitted from the influx. This is all good for the town.

Nominations for the annual Australia Day awards are now open and will hopefully attract a range of worthy nominees. Readers are requested to examine the various categories and consider whether they might know someone who might warrant a nomination in one or another.

A nomination is a good way of showing your appreciation for some of our many volunteers, so please pick up a form and go to work.

You may have read a recent media release announcing that Colina Grant had been chosen as the NSW Artist of the Year. Colina is currently exhibiting at the Grenfell Art Gallery and has many very worthwhile works on display. The relevant thing to local art fans is that her works are available at pre-award prices up until the end of this exhibition. There is no doubt she will be able to increase her prices and will surely go on to bigger and better things, so our present exhibition is a bit of a coup.

Come down and have a look. It's very easy to see why she won the award.

A couple of reminders to finish off.

The monthly Council meeting will be held at 5.00 pm this Thursday and all residents are invited to attend if they wish.

This will be followed by a sale of land for unpaid rates next Friday morning at the Community Hub. Thankfully these sales don't occur very often but they are a necessary thing every so often, to write off outstanding debts and allow someone a fresh start.




