Whooping cough

There has been a recent increase of whooping cough (pertussis) among primary-school-aged children and a modest increase in high schools. Coughing spreads the infection to others nearby. Whooping cough caught at school can spread to younger brothers and sisters at home and can be especially dangerous for babies.

Whooping cough starts like a cold and progresses to bouts of coughing that can last for many weeks. Older children may just have a cough that is persistent and is worse at night. The infection can occur even in fully-vaccinated children. Children with symptoms should see a GP. If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough, please let the school know and keep your child at home until they have taken five days of antibiotics. Keep coughing children away from babies.

Whooping cough vaccines give good protection against infection but immunity fades. If your school-aged child has younger siblings, it's a good idea to check that they are up to date with their vaccines. More information at www.health.nsw.gov.au

- * Read to your child in your first language research shows that using your first language will help your child when he or she learns to read English.
- * Try not to let television intrude on reading time set aside some uninterrupted time to read with your child.
- * Listen to your child read every day, even if only for a short time. Give books as treats and presents.
- * Discuss the meanings of stories and words.

COUNCIL NEWS 22/11/2010

The Mayor has recently taken this health business to heart, by spending last weekend in Cowra Hospital. He claimed he had some sort of infection but we all know that was just a cover so that he could have a close look at how the place works.

He should be out by the time this is published.

With the pending retirement of Dr Varejka, GWAHS has dropped its plans for a special VMO just for the hospital and will now resume its advertising campaign for a replacement doctor/VMO. Council will be assisting in this campaign as in the past.

I'm not sure why people would think there's a conspiracy to close the Hospital. Such an outcome is already within the power of GWAHS if it wanted to, and all they would have to do is point to the absence of the doctors.

In the meantime the nurses are doing their best to keep things going and GWAHS is providing occasional locums for the MPS and coordinating the advertising campaign for a replacement.

The decision not to continue as VMOs has been made by the doctors, not GWAHS, and the decision to return to the Hospital is likewise in the hands of the doctors.

Still on health matters, Council has been forwarded information by the NSW Department of Health about the increasing incidence of Whooping Cough in young children. This disease leads to pneumonia and possible brain damage and can be life threatening for babies.

One of the consequences of the community's increased awareness of environmental matters such as drugs and chemicals in food and water, seems to be an aversion to immunisation by some young families. This probably makes the parents feel they are doing the right thing but it isn't much help to their child if it contracts a preventable disease.

Council has received a small number of brochures on Whooping Cough, or you can visit the Australian Government's website at <u>www.immunise.health.gov.au</u> for information.

Last week's Council Meeting began with a presentation to Council by four young students from THLHS. These were Ben and Kate Kelly representing the School Bands, and Rhys Thompson-Jones and Curtis Schaefer representing the Science/Engineering Challenge Team.

The students described their successes at the Hawkesbury Eisteddfod and National Finals respectively, and expressed their appreciation on behalf of their groups for Council's support of \$1000 to each group.

In the absence of the Mayor, Deputy Mayor Nevin Hughes responded by congratulating the students on their successes and conveying Council's and the Community's pride in the local High School and its students.

On more mundane matters, Council will be attending a Centroc meeting this Thursday at Orange.

This meeting will also include the AGM, with the Executive positions up for grabs. In recent years Centroc has been led by the Mayor of Lithgow, Neville Castle, but the new President will be the Mayor of Forbes, Phyllis Miller. Other positions will have to be determined by vote.

Centroc has been described by Federal politicians as the leading ROC (Regional Organisation of Councils) in Australia, and is having little trouble in getting to see Ministers and Shadow Ministers at both State and Federal level. It is a great example of regional cooperation and networking, and has the potential to be of great assistance to Weddin Shire.

Have you noticed the new plantings in the two roundabouts and adjacent blisters? The plants are beginning to flower and look a treat, with many favourable comments being made. It's good to see our wet season is helping the town gardens as well as the crops.






