BEEF STIR FRY

450g lean beef strips

1 teaspoon garlic, crushed

1 teaspoon ginger, finely chopped

2 tablespoons hoisin sauce

1 tablespoon soy sauce

2 tablespoons white wine

³/₄ cup water

1 teaspoon beef stock powder

1 tablespoon cornflour

1 dessertspoon sugar

1 cup each snow peas, sliced mushrooms, sliced red capsicum, small broccoli florets, bok choy coarsely chopped


 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sliced shallots

Saute ginger and garlic for 1 minute in a non-stick frypan that has been coated with cooking spray.

Add beef strips and sauté till cooked. Drain and set aside.

In the same frypan spray again, stir fry capsicum and broccoli for 3 minutes then add in remaining vegetables, toss until tender crisp. Stir in wine, soy sauce, hoisin sauce and sugar int40 pan. Combine cornflour, stock powder and water together then add to pan, bring to boil mixing well. Return beef strips and stir through.

Serve with boiled rice or noodles.

WEDDIN SHIRE COUNCIL NEWS 23/11/2011

The Mayor and General Manager recently attended the 2011 National Local Roads and Transport Congress, organised annually by the Australian Local Government Association. The theme this year was "Better Roads are Safer Roads" and much of the Congress was devoted to road safety matters.

The other focus of the Congress was to show support for the Roads to Recovery Programme which has so far contributed almost \$5 million of Federal money to the upgrading and improvement of local roads within Weddin Shire. This additional funding has given a great boost to our shire as well as many others, and the broad support for the Roads to Recovery program was evidenced by the attendance of over 300 delegates. The ALGA will now use the Congress to lobby for not only the retention of the programme, but also for increased funding.

Another meeting of the Ministerial Taskforce for the rail re-opening was held at Cowra this Monday, with representatives from all five councils in attendance as well as officers from NSW Transport.

The meeting considered the final report of Booz & Co which was accepted subject to a number of qualifications, including an expression of concern at the low level of freight identified which has resulted in a benefit – cost ratio of less than one.

Quite coincidently, two new potential users have been located, both of which are looking to utilise rail to haul logs and woodchips between Oberon and Cootamundra. The freight volume for these two companies exceeds the quantity required to give a positive return on the line, and concerted efforts are being made to sign them up for the presentation to the Minister.

The Congress was remarkable for the scarcity of politicians with only a dour Warren Truss and an entertaining Barnaby Joyce fronting to put their party's policy on Roads to Recovery. The controversial independent Tony Windsor was scheduled to speak but failed to appear, and there were no representatives at all from the Federal Government. It may have been such a sunny day in Canberra that no-one wanted to leave, but perhaps the presence of the visiting President of the United States had something to do with it.

There were a number of important issues discussed at this week's Council Meeting. One of these was what to do about Bogolong Dam. Having previously decided not to accept responsibility for this dam because of the potentially high costs involved, this time Council has agreed to have a full assessment of the condition of the dam and the likely costs involved in taking it over from Central Tablelands Water (subject to their agreement). There is also a need to ascertain the regulatory requirements of any Government departments which could still have a say. Council is liaising in this matter with the local community committee and will strive to work towards the optimum solution for all concerned.

The matter of using B-double trucks on council roads has again arisen, with requests from grain haulage companies for new routes. There are two important considerations with those trucks. The first is that the road authority has established minimum standards for roads where B-doubles may operate. These standards include the width of seal, the width of culverts, the condition of the road and other factors, and are particularly aimed at ensuring the safety of other road users. A school bus or a parent taking the kids to school does not want to meet a fastmoving B-double on a narrow road and have to take evasive action.

The second consideration is that Council's insurance company has advised that a road should not be opened to B-doubles unless it meets the required standard, and to do so may negate Council's public liability insurance. This would have significant consequences should an accident occur.

It is understood that some neighbouring councils have taken a more cavalier approach and may have opened some roads without due process. This would be a risk that those councils have chosen to take.

In the meantime Council is continuing to work on widening the most requested routes such as the Mary Gilmore Way beyond Bimbi, so that a growing network of suitable roads will be available for future grain haulage.




