The next service at St Peter's Anglican Church Will be held on Sunday 19th February 2012 at 11.30am



WHITE CHRISTMAS:

Ingredients:

1 ½ eups rice bubbles teup powdered milk teup ieing sugar 1 eup desiecated coconut 1/3 eup gach red glacg cherrigs, green glacg cherrigs and sultanas 250g copha

Method:


Ling a 18 x 28cm shallow tin with foil

Mix the rice bubbles, powdered milk, icing sugar, ecconut and fruit in a large bowl. Make a well in the centre.

Melt the copha in a pan over low heat, then allow to cool slightly. Pour into the well and stir until all the ingredients are moistened. Spoon into the tin and smooth the surface.

Refrigerate for 30 minutes, or until set, before cutting.

News from the Quandialla District Scholarship Committee

Year 10 Scholarship:

After a consultative meeting on Tuesday, 28th June, 2011, the Quandialla District Scholarship Committee decided on the criteria for the awarding of the 'Year 10 Scholarship'.

Any child that meets the following criteria can apply for the Year 10 Quandialla District Scholarship.

Year 10 Scholarship Criteria:

- Minimum of 6 years schooling at Quandialla Central School;
- Year 10 School Certificate results will need to be supplied when applying for this Scholarship, and will be used in determining the successful candidate;
- Behaviour and effort will be considered;
- Current Year 10 School Report must be included with the student's application.

Due date for applications: Monday, 27th February, 2012

Quandialla District Further Studies Grant – Tafe Scholarship (Full time Tafe course):

(This course is defined as one that is part of an apprenticeship or a course that runs for a period of two years or more)

This Scholarship is available to any student who is leaving Quandialla Central School from Year 10 onwards and continuing further education in the following year in a full time Tafe approved course.

Applicants attending full time Tafe/Apprenticeship courses can apply for money to the value of \$400.00. Payments to be made in two (2) payments. One payment at the commencement of the course, and the second payment to be made in the final year/or second year.

Quandialla District Further Studies Grant – Tafe Scholarship (Short term course):

This Scholarship is available to any student who is leaving Quandialla Central School from Year 10 onwards and continuing further education in the following year in a short term Tafe approved course.

Students completing short courses can apply for a one off payment of \$150.00.

Criteria for Tafe Scholarships (Full time or Short term courses):

Resume to be submitted to the Scholarship Committee comprising:

- Course name and outline;
- Duration of course;
- Written submission outlining why you are an appropriate candidate for this Scholarship;
- Proof of enrolment.

Quandialla District University Scholarship:

Applicants must have completed at least 6 years of schooling at Quandialla Central School to be eligible for this scholarship, and should be 21 years and under to apply.

The Quandialla District Scholarship Committee will pay a one-off payment of \$200.00 to the successful applicant.

Criteria for University Scholarship:

Resume to be submitted to the Scholarship Committee comprising:

- University course name and outline;
- Duration of course;
- Written submission outlining why you are an appropriate candidate for this Scholarship (500 words);
- Proof of enrolment.

Due date for all Scholarships: Monday, 27th February, 2012 Please contact the Secretary on 6347 1294 for application forms or for further information.

WEDDIN SHIRE COUNCIL NEWS 7/12/11

Work has commenced on the new doctor's house with preparations for the concrete slab currently underway. Council will be pushing for an early finish were possible, but if the doctor arrives before the house is completed, then temporary accommodation will be arranged for the necessary period.

Renovations of the Burrangong Street surgery are nearing completion with various local tradesmen hard at it. Some services such as air conditioning and computer cabling will be installed shortly, and a proper disabled entry will also be available. Former patients of Dr Varejka will appreciate the many improvements.

Council has been notified that the Federal Department of Health and Ageing has opened another round of infrastructure grants, so Council will again apply for funding for a medical centre. A professional advisory firm has been engaged to help prepare the application and hopefully improve our chances of success.

Of course, should the application be approved, Council will then have to build or buy a second house.

It is understood the Grenfell Citizens Health Action Committee Inc is undergoing changes of personnel.

This is an important time for health matters as everyone would be aware. Council is happy to continue to liaise with the committee where appropriate for the overall benefit of the community.

The Federal Government has launched a new initiative through the Department of Health and Ageing, called Rural and Regional Health Australia. This is a service aimed at giving rural people information about health and aged care programs and services in their local area.

The Division of Local Government has released its report on Comparative Information on Councils for 2009/2010. This report compares information on a wide range of activities for all councils in the State, and is meant to give an indication of how efficient a council may be.

Also last week the Grenfell TAFE College was the venue for the launch of a new high tech initiative named TAFE Western Connect. By using advanced technology including videoconferencing, students in Grenfell will be able to participate in classes at bigger centres without having to travel to those centres.

This has the potential to be of great value to local students and the local TAFE College, and should result in courses being taken which were not available here before. If you have a child or a grandchild who might benefit from this, urge them to contact Brian Johnson at TAFE – Phone 6343 1786.


