APPLE & PEAR STRUDEL

Ingredients:

2 green apples, peeled, cored and chopped
1 ripe pear, peeled, cored and chopped
2 tablespoons easter sugar
1/4 cup sultanas
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon + extra 1/2 teaspoon
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
8 sheets filo pastry
60g butter, melted
2 tablespoons dried breadcrumbs

Method:

In a medium saucepan, combine apple, pear, sugar and 2 tablespoons water. Stir over a low heat until sugar dissolves. Simmer covered for 5 minutes until just tender. Stir in spices and sultanas. Cool.

Preheat oven to moderate, 1800C. Line oven tray with baking paper.

Place 1 sheet of filo on a clean bench. Brush lightly with butter and sprinkle over 1 teaspoon of breadcrumbs. Repeat layers using all 8 sheets of filo.

Arrange fruit lengthways across filo, leaving an 8cm border at the short ends. Fold in ends and then roll to enclose. Place seam-side down on tray and brush with remaining butter. Sprinkle with the extra einnamon.

Bake 30-35 minutes, until crisp. Serve with custard or ice-cream.

WEDDIN SHIRE COUNCIL NEWS 30/11/11

There is a need to correct some of the comments in the local paper over the last few weeks.

The doctor from Penrith was not turned away, he himself lost interest when he was informed about the present and the new doctors, a situation he did not seem to be aware of. He was not offered a short term contract, he was asked whether he was interested in a short-term position (which he declined). The Area Health Service was not aware of his proposal and he had not been accepted as a VMO. His proposal to place doctors here on a rotating basis needs careful consideration as some people may not care to see a different doctor every time they attend the surgery. The doctor made no enquiries about accommodation, travelling or the surgery, and it is not known whether his demands would have been possible or affordable.

Council is outlaying a good deal of the community's money in preparation for Dr Patrick, by building a new house and renovating the surgery. These two premises have been offered to Dr Patrick on the basis of a weekly rental: they are not free. Council has also agreed to contribute \$10,000 towards the Area Health Service's costs for the recruitment agency, but there has been no agreement at this stage to contribute anything towards his relocation costs, and certainly not "to the tune of \$100,000". Most people seem to be pleased that a breakthrough has been made and that a doctor is coming, although they would like to see him sooner rather than later. We will need to make Dr Patrick and his family feel welcome once they do arrive. The ongoing talk about other doctors is now irrelevant and is only serving to detract from our new doctor. Despite the extended delay, Dr Patrick should provide Grenfell with a stable practice and is considered to offer the best solution at this time.

The Grenfell Christmas Lights competition has received a boost this year with Essential Energy offering sponsorship of \$300 and the Grenfell Car Club another \$50. This will double the usual prizemoney and make it more worthwhile to outlay a little on some extra lights.

Various competitions will also be conducted in the villages, with prizemoney provided by the Council.

Council's Annual Report for 2010/2011 is now available on request at the office, or it may be accessed from Council's website. The Report includes the Supplementary State of Environment Report and the Annual Statements, and should give ratepayers and residents a comprehensive picture of the workings of the Council.

As previously advertised, Council's auditor gave a presentation before the commencement of the November Meeting, with an interested crowd in the gallery to take note.

The auditor presented a series of powerpoint graphs and charts, with comparisons with other councils within the same category. Once again, the Council's finances were described as very healthy and the staff were praised for their diligence. All our staff have contributed to the year's good result, from the road workers to the office staff, and due credit was given to all concerned.

Some changes have been made to the next two Council Meetings. The December Meeting will still be held on Thursday 15 December 2011, but it will commence at 8.30 am. The January Meeting has been cancelled. Hopefully no-one has booked their
