

ZUCCHINI & CHEESE SLICE

Ingredients:

4 medium zucchini, grated

- 1 small onion, grated
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 2 teaspoons dried thyme

2 tablespoons finely chopped basil leaves

250g fresh low-fat cottage or ricotta cheese

4 eggs



Method:

Preheat oven to 180oC (160oC fan forced). Grease and line a medium sized loaf pan with baking paper.

Squeeze zucchini to remove as much juice as possible. Heat a frying pan over medium heat. Spray with olive oil spray. Add the zucchini, onion, garlic and herbs. Cook until softened. Remove from heat and allow to cool.

Bland ricotta and eggs until smooth, stir through zucchini mix. Pour into prepared pan and bake for 30-35 minutes or until cooked.

Serve sliced with a salad.

WEDDIN SHIRE COUNCIL NEWS 14/11/2012

By now many people would be aware that former mayor Maurice Simpson is in a Canberra Hospital undergoing precautionary tests after feeling unwell last weekend. I'm sure I speak for all in wishing him a speedy recovery.

As a consequence of his absence, Council decided to postpone the Councillor Appreciation Dinner due to be held this Tuesday. A new date will be organised once Mo is fit and well again.

Staff have contacted all the people on the attendance list, so that no-one was caught unawares. Many representatives of surrounding councils were attending in addition to a good roll-up of local people, and hopefully the new date will continue to suit everyone. Any pre-paid funds will be held for the next time and refunded if unable to attend.

The Grenfell Pool is open for business and the water looks clear and inviting, if a little cool.

Council is still being contacted by people concerned about water quality. Whilst there may be occasional problems with the water clarity, the disinfection process is working well and there have been no potential health problems, either this year or last year.

Council is required to carry out regular testing for water quality. Should a substandard test be recorded, the pool manager will take the appropriate steps which may involve closing the pool until the problem is rectified. However this has not occurred in the past and is not anticipated to be a problem this season either.

Christmas is just around the corner and Council has given approval for the Grenfell Association of Churches to again use Taylor Park for the annual Carols in the Park. This is scheduled for Sunday 16 December, from 6.00pm to 10.00pm, weather permitting.

Council has also agreed to sponsor the usual Christmas competitions in Grenfell and the villages.

It will be interesting to see how many households participate in the Christmas lights competition with the rising cost of electricity. It shouldn't be too bad if people control their hours of use and shorten the display period to say, a couple of weeks before Christmas. These displays create a lot of interest and give a lot of pleasure to the community, and it would be a pity not to have them.

A reminder that the annual awards for Australia Day are currently open for nominations. Suitable forms are available from the Council Chambers.

The Mayor and General Manager have attended several meeting of the rail group recently, with the councils agreeing to appoint a consultant to assist with the preparation of an application for Federal funding. If successful, this application has the potential to contribute half the \$30 million cost of restoring the line.

The group has been strongly supported by the Member for Burrinjuck Katrina Hodgkinson, and the councils took the opportunity at last week's CENTROC summit in Bathurst to brief the Member for Bathurst, Paul Toole, and the Member for Orange, Andrew Gee. Both parliamentarians voiced their support of the rail re-opening project and congratulated the councils on their initiative.




