Students will join two virtual excursions one to the Art Gallery of NSW to meet the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Curators and learn more about artworks in the gallery. At the second virtual excursion students will guide teachers and students through an artmaking lesson developed by Jonathan Jones (Wiradjuri artist and curator).

Teachers will be supported through online resources and connections to visual arts expert educators from the Arts Unit as well as expert knowledge from curators at the AGNSW and the Wagga Wagga Art Gallery.

At the completion of the program students will exhibit their artmaking in their regional gallery alongside the works created by other students in the program.
